
The Session has asked me to extend our special thanks for all of the hard work and the inspiration which you contributed to Youth Sunday on April 25.





Longs named BG family of year

Right now, Andy Long calls Togo, West Africa home. Geography notwithstanding, he's just been named a member of the Bowling Green Family of the Year for 1988.

Andy, 27, one of the four children of Clifford and Lyn Long, 1005 Gustin Ave., is currently serving in Africa as a Peace Corps volunteer.

His next letter from home is likely to include the details of how the family learned about the annual honor, presented in an awards ceremony Sunday. The Family of the Year competition is co-sponsored by the city and the local Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

The other members of the Long family are sons Steve, 29, a senior statistician at National Family Opinion, and Thad, 25, a manager at the Bowling Green State University Recreation Center; and daughter Mindy, 20, currently a student at BGSU.

The Long family has close ties to BGSU, where Cliff is a mathematics professor. Steve, Andy and Thad all earned their bachelor's degrees from the university.

Long, along with three other mathematicians, sings in a barbershop quartet called the Logarythms. They have performed at the Wood County Senior Center and at local nursing homes.

Those nominated for the Family of the Year title are asked to fill out an application listing their professional and community service involvements. In the case of the Long family, the list is fairly lengthy.

In fact, this is the second time the Longs were recommended as nominees for the honor, according to Long. "We're very pleased" to have been chosen, he added.

All the members of the family have been involved with the American Red Cross in one capacity or another. As a registered nurse, Mrs. Long does health histories at blood banks held throughout the year at churches and on campus. Mindy has helped with campus blood banks.

Mindy was also on the search committee which selected a new minister at the church the family attends, First Presbyterian. She and Thad have taught church school classes and all members of the family have been part of the church's music program. Steve is currently serving on the board of elders, while Mrs. Long is a member of the board of trustees.

In 1986 Mrs. Long was named by the Bowling Green Chamber of Commerce as Outstanding Woman Citizen. She believes that honor was based largely on her involvement in the Hospice program and getting the hospital's Wheeled Meals program for shut-ins started.

"I've been president of the Wood County Hospital Guild, which has been able to purchase a great deal of equipment for the hospital through money-making projects. There is a sense of satisfaction in such involvement and I have made many good friends as a result," she noted on the family's application.

Andy has been teaching mathematics to high school age students in West Africa for the past two years. It will be another year before he comes home and the "Family of the Year" can celebrate together again.






